One Paragraph on Repealing and Replacing Obamacare

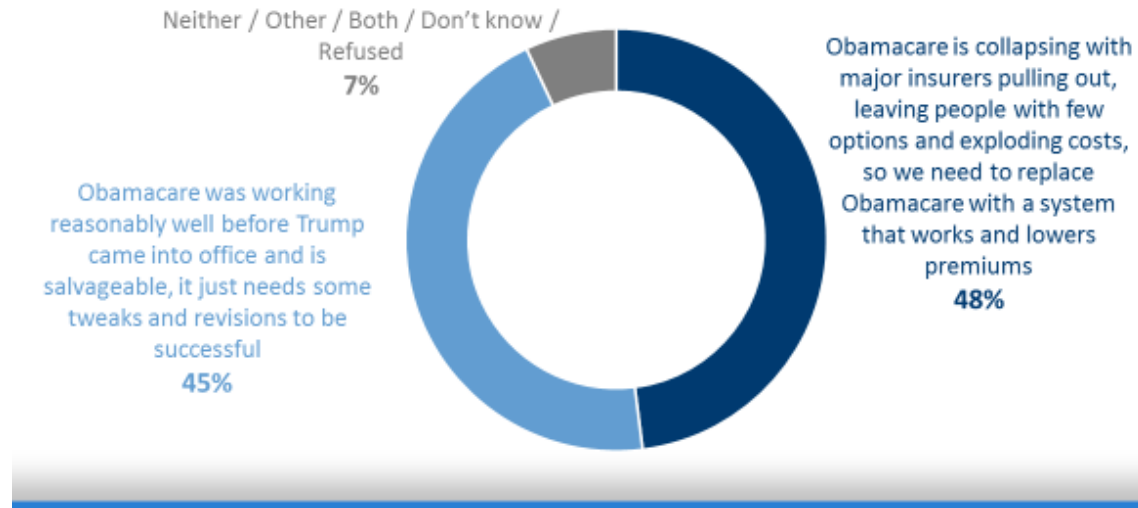
Based on One Nation Battleground State Issue Survey, July 5-9, 2017

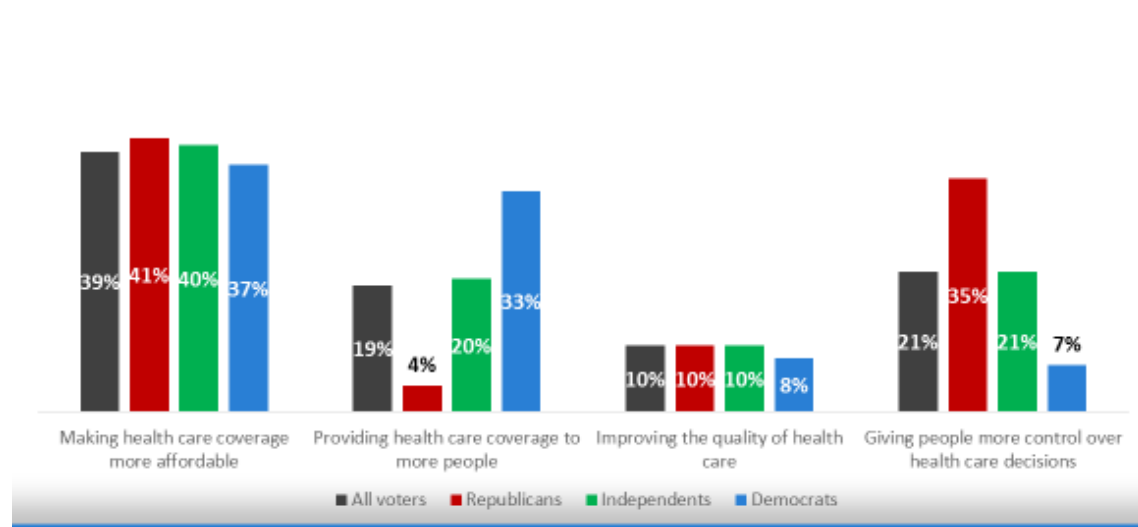
Obamacare is Collapsing

Thinking further about Obamacare, which of the following two viewpoints is closer to your own?



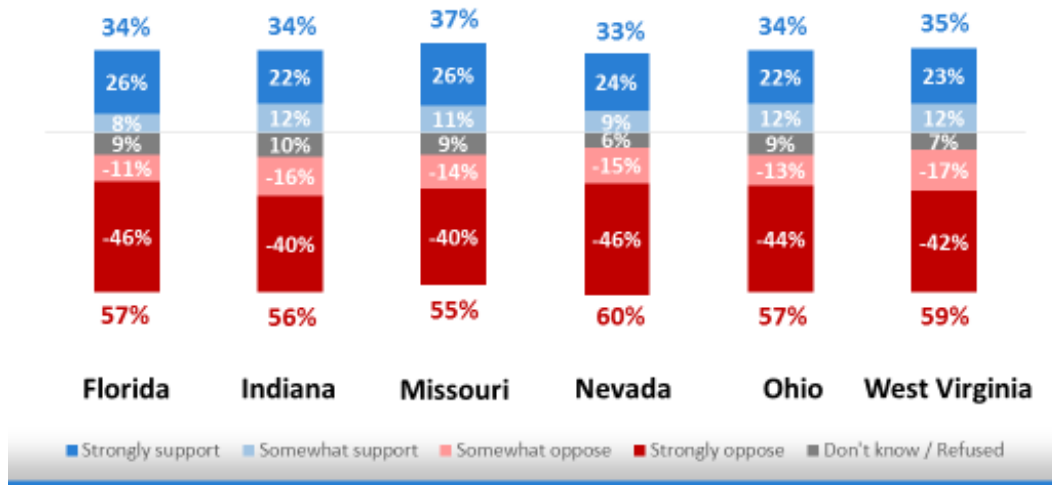
Healthcare Priorities

Democratic Opposition

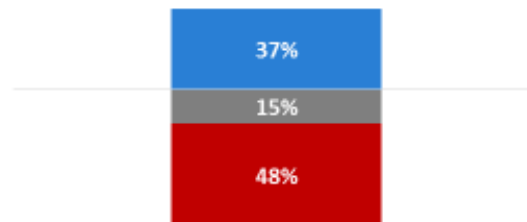

We should expand Medicare from just covering seniors to covering all Americans

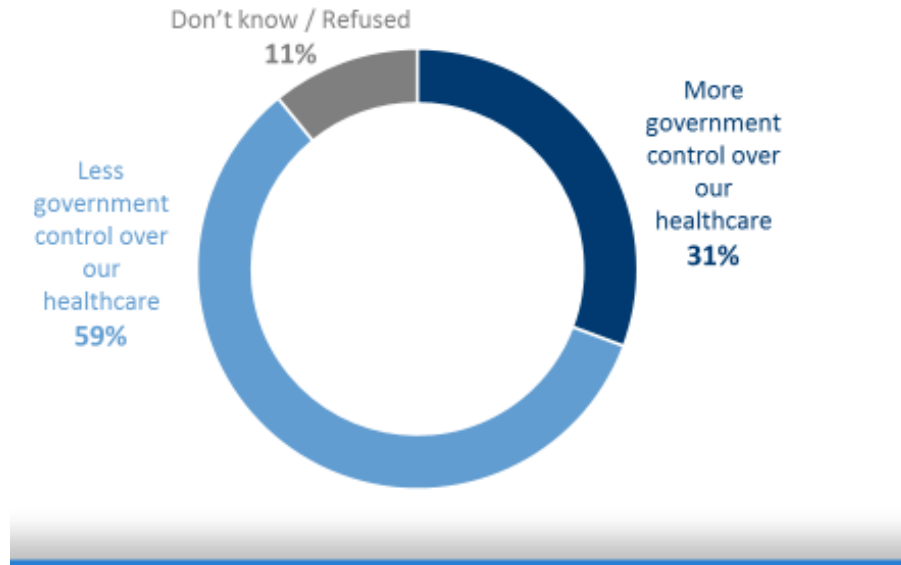


Opening up Medicare to millions of additional people would risk bankrupting the program

Legend: ■ Democratic viewpoint ■ Neither / Other / Both / Don't know / Refused ■ Republican viewpoint

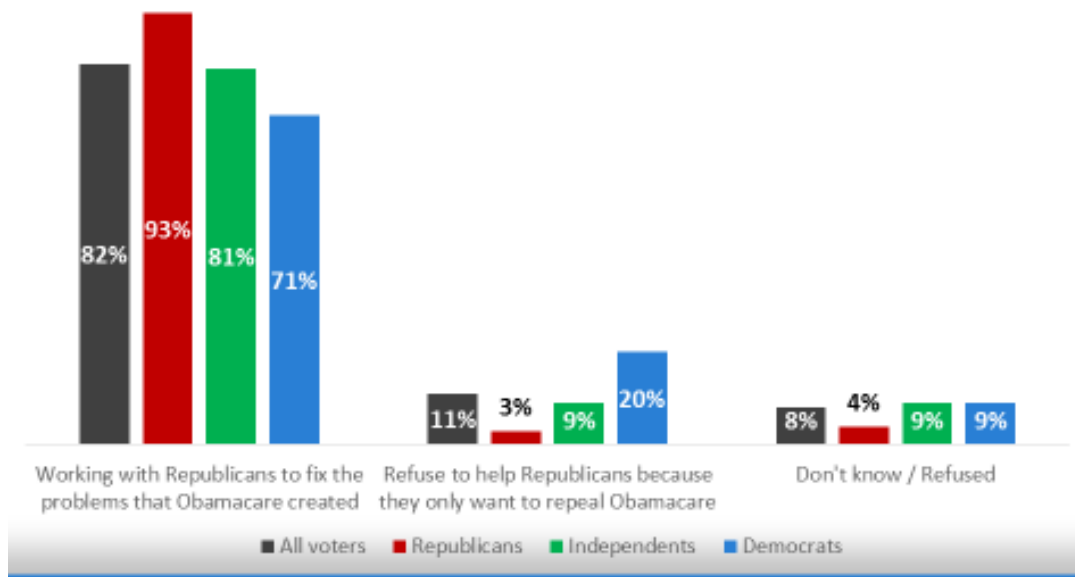
