


#### Core Findings

- The *Dobbs* decision has recharged the abortion debate and shifted more people (including some Republicans) into the anti-*Dobbs* "pro-choice" camp.
- Voters have distorted views about what "pro-life" and "pro-choice" actually mean:
  - "Pro-life"= flat ban on abortion without exceptions
  - "Pro-choice" = varied levels of restrictions
- Talking about federalism and "leaving it to the states" isn't adequate; voters want to hear policy specifics.
- Voters strongly support exceptions to abortion bans (rape/incest/life of mother).
- Voters broadly support some restrictions on abortion and oppose unlimited abortion.
  - Research shows support for restrictions after 12 or 15 weeks.

- % Pro-choice - % Pro-life


Gallup's 2022 polling saw 55% identify as "pro-choice," the highest share recorded since 1995.

# Lots Of "Gray Area" Among GOP Voters Esp. Women, <45, No Degree




Do you think of yourself as more pro-choice, pro-life, or somewhere in between?



### Women (Including Conservatives) Want To Hear From Women




Women should have the loudest voice in the abortion debate, and male politicians should stay out of the debate.



# Voters Generally Oppose The *Dobbs*Decision – And With Intensity




Overall, do you generally support or oppose the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to overturn *Roe v. Wade*, giving states the ability to restrict abortion?

- Understanding / empathy for difficult situations (rape/incest).
- Some access, to a point.
- Guardrails to keep liberals from over-reaching.
- Honesty: "I am pro-life and...".

"We should be able to understand when the right time period is and give women some options."


"I don't want abortion up until the moment of birth, but we have to understand that every case is different. There has to be exceptions and some limits that account for each situation."

### Despite General Opposition To *Dobbs*, Most Voters Want Restrictions




In your opinion, when should abortion be legal?



## Broad Support for Some Abortion Restrictions—and Exceptions




Below are some statements that have been made about abortion. For each one, please mark whether you agree or disagree with that statement.



### 15 Weeks Is A Compromise But Divides AXIS Republicans



The law under *Roe vs. Wade* was that abortion could be banned at 22/24 weeks. Now some states have passed a ban at 6 weeks. We should find a middle ground, like a 15-week ban on abortions.




"It's middle ground, neither side gets everything that they wanted. That's called lawmaking."
